





Q1: ISSUANCES & SALES FOR SCALE

Nexus' carbon finance teams laid the groundwork for a year of continued **support for our carbon partners across Southeast Asia.** In Q1 we saw successful issuance of credits from our clean cooking project, Improved Cookstove Program Laos, and continued to sell credits for our Cambodia based clean water partner, Hydrologic, that enables them to continue to scale clean water access in rural communities.

Q2: FUELING WOMEN-LED CLIMATE INNOVATION

Nexus' Pioneer Facility made a catalytic \$250,000 loan to HUSK, a women-led regenerative agriculture company driving biochar innovation in Southeast Asia. HUSK turns rice husk waste into carbon-sequestering fertilizers that boost soil health and increase smallholder farmers incomes.

What makes HUSK exceptional isn't just the climate impact, it's their commitment to gender inclusion. Through their "Super Farmer" program, women are trained as carbon farming ambassadors and earn sustainable incomes by selling biofertilizers door-to-door. This model empowers women while scaling regenerative agriculture across Cambodia.

Q3: A BOLDER NEXUS

In 2024, we launched a bolder vision and mission to better reflect our expanding scope. Our new mission centers our commitment to financing organisations that are benefiting both people and the planet. It serves as:

- A reflection of our broader sectoral focus, beyond clean energy and water, now also including sustainable agriculture and waste management
- An expanded geographical footprint to include other countries across Asia, in alignment with UN targets to support women-led climate enterprises in Bangladesh







We joined the panel of a high-level workshop with the **Environment Programme, UN Women,** Chamroeun, and ARDB on promoting climate-smart, women-led enterprises. This event spotlighted the urgent need for more inclusive climate finance, and positioned Nexus as a key player in that conversation in Cambodia.

Q4: PIONEERING CARBON INNOVATION IN LIVESTOCK

We closed the year with a promising new carbon feasibility project that demonstrates Nexus' technical depth and commitment to high-integrity solutions.

In Lao PDR, our carbon team began work with AgCoTech, an enterprise exploring innovative ways to reduce methane emissions from livestock. This project involves developing a Gold Standard methodology deviation, positioning AgCoTech as a potential pioneer in livestock emissions reduction within Southeast Asia.








Interest in agricultural methane mitigation is rapidly growing, and we're working with partners to help scale its potential

PARTNER SPOTLIGHT: IMPROVED COOKSTOVES LAOS

THE CHALLENGE

In rural Lao PDR, traditional cooking methods, open fires and inefficient stoves, posed a triple threat: hazardous indoor air pollution, excessive fuel consumption, and high CO₂ emissions. Women and children are most at risk, with respiratory illnesses on the rise and hours lost each day collecting firewood.



Clean cooking access for low-income communities

THE SOLUTION

Enter ARMI's Improved Cookstoves Project, a locally led initiative distributing affordable, energy-efficient stoves to rural households. Backed by carbon finance through Nexus for Development, the project reduces both emissions and household energy costs, while creating jobs across the cookstove supply chain.
